Rev Barry Writes.....



The summer has passed all too quickly for my liking. I know not everyone will agree, particularly those juggling childcare and covering for those on holiday at work. I like the quieter rush-hour, sharing stories of people's travels, and of course, the better weather.

We are all settling into a new season. A new academic term with all the change and challenges that brings, and increased workloads for many as we see the workplace come to the end of another holiday period. The autumn is coming and the days are growing shorter. People are either talking of their plans for Christmas or complaining that Christmas comes earlier every year. We so often sound surprised, yet it is the same every year.

There is a yearly cycle of change, each met with joy or despair depending on how each of us is affected. Yet, there is something common to all of us, and that is hope. If we are enthusiastic about a new season, we have hope of the joy and benefit we wish for. If we are pessimistic, we have the hope in the knowledge that another change will follow. Life is all about seasons and change, whether yearly or randomly, and it always has been.

During the weeks of the summer at St Nicholas, we have been running a series of informal talks focussing on the Old Testament. This has not been an in-depth analysis of meaning, but an overview of each book to ascertain the overall meaning and purpose of particular texts. We have learnt much; particularly, we were surprised by the number of people who attended as we had not appreciated the high level of interest. This is an example of hope in itself, much preparation goes into such a project and there is the hope that someone will come. We were then met with the joy that so many attended. There is no greater joy for a preacher than having people appreciate that which they feel God is asking them to share.

As we looked at the wealth of knowledge and wisdom within the Old Testament, there plain to see is this pattern of seasons. Often spanning many years, with battles of optimism and pessimism. Times when things turn from good to bad and bad to good, of impatience and a distrust of leaders and of God. But, always a voice of hope, something to cling to that makes continuing worthwhile. A hope based on good and the ways of God that overcome the greedy and the oppressive. That hope is still as obvious today if we look closely enough.

JAHFA Visit to the Bruderhof Community



On 7th August, St. Nicholas Church Youth Group visited the Bruderhof community in Nonington. Originating in Germany, the Bruderhof Community try to live their lives like the first disciples as described in the Acts of the Apostles. This means they share everything, money and possessions, living as a group of families, chil-

dren and older people who are self-dependent. However, they still believe that everyone should have an experience of the "outside world" and so people are required to move regularly globally, they accept regular visitors and they often trade or go on days out in the local community.

When we arrived, we were greeted with open arms (and cookies!) It was then they explained to us a little bit about their way of life which equally amazed and baffled us. It was hard to understand the fact they share absolutely everything and have no pos-



sessions of their own which is an alien concept to us. The community are as self sufficient as they can be so we next visited their huge vegetable patch where they generously offered us as many huge vegetables as we could carry! We then had an amazing ride in a carriage pulled by two of their beautiful horses. This was an incredible opportunity to see around their land which was teeming with wildlife.

Thereon we looked round the various animals they owned, some were pets and some were for sale including pigs, ferrets, horses, donkeys, dogs, rabbits and bees. Followed by a delicious barbeque lunch of homemade burgers and german sausages plus a tour of their extensive

grounds and their schools. We had the opportunity to ask as many questions as possible and observe the day to day life that is a reality for people in these communities globally. That ended our time at the Bruderhof, more information is available on their website <https://www.bruderhof.com/en>.

However that didn't conclude our day... We travelled back to Maidstone to go bowling! (Fiona was very proud to say that she won.)



Note from the Editor

I have included some text from the Bruderhof Community website to further understand their origins and faith.

The Basis of our Faith

Our life together is founded on Jesus, the Christ and son of God. We recognize the Bible's authority over all aspects of our belief and life, and we affirm the rule of faith stated in the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds. We are particularly influenced and inspired by the New Testament's Acts 2 and 4 and the Sermon on the Mount, which direct us to embrace communal living and lifelong service to others. We desire to remain true to this calling all our lives.

Founded in 1920 in Germany, the Bruderhof ("place of brothers" in German) has its roots in the Anabaptist tradition of Europe's Radical Reformation. We practice adult baptism. We are also pacifists and conscientious objectors. While we love our countries and countrymen, our faith transcends political and nationalistic affiliations.

Other religious movements stemming from the Anabaptist tradition include the Mennonites and Amish. We, however, are most similar to and inspired by the sixteenth-century Hutterites, who shared a community of goods and sought to live in brotherly and sisterly love.

The Bruderhof does not want a religion that seeks the future of humanity only beyond this earthly life, thus satisfying people with mere spirituality. Humanity needs help here and now. By following Jesus' practical commands, we feel we are doing what we can to advance God's kingdom here on earth.

Some of Our Guiding Biblical Texts:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And fear came upon every soul; and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and had all things in common; and they sold their possessions and

goods and distributed them to all, as any had need.

Acts 2:42-45

Now the company of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one said that any of the things which he possessed was his own, but they had everything in common. And with great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the proceeds of what was sold and laid it at the apostles' feet; and distribution was made to each as any had need.

WHO ARE THEY?

Where did all the Christian denominations come from?

Have you ever wondered about the beginnings of the Eastern Orthodox Churches? the Roman Catholic Church? the Church of England? the Baptists? the Presbyterians? the Pentecostals? Where did all these denominations come from and why did they start in the first place? Why don't we have one Christian Church around the world to which all Christians belong? Don't all Christians believe, more or less, the same doctrines? Don't all these doctrines come from one Book – the Bible? And, in particular, don't all Christians worship the same God? If so, why are there so many denominations? so many divisions? so many different names for Christian churches? This series will try and answer these questions, so look out for your denomination and where it came from!

We begin with: **Eastern Orthodox Churches.**

In this brief summary the Eastern Orthodox Churches will be referred to as Orthodoxy. This does not mean orthodoxy as opposed to heresy; rather it is a convenient name for these Churches that originated in the East in the earliest days of Christendom.



Orthodoxy can rightly claim to be the oldest part of the Christian Church. As early as Acts 13 we have the record of how the Christian Church in Antioch, in Syria, sent out the first Christian missionaries, Barnabas and Saul (later Paul). Already the centre of gravity in the Church was moving from Jerusalem, where it began at Pentecost, and out into the Gentile world. Over the next few centuries great Christian centres grew up in Antioch, in Caesarea, in Alexandria in Egypt, and in Constantinople in Asia Minor (now Turkey). Some of these churches were established before there was a Christian Church in Rome, and this fact is very important for the subsequent history of Christianity.

At the beginning of the fourth century, the Roman Empire divided into an Eastern Empire and a Western Empire. In this way the Churches in the Empire were known as Eastern or Western, depending on their geographical location. So Constantinople was very clearly an Eastern Church while the Church in Rome was clearly a Western Church. Even when the Empire was later united under the rule of the first Christian Emperor, Constantine (276? – 337), the East/West division of the Church continued.

The fourth and fifth centuries witnessed the Church's great theological battles on Christology and Trinitarian doctrines. At Church Councils held at Ephesus in 431 AD and at Chalcedon in 451 AD, it was apparent that a rift was developing between the Eastern and Western Churches. Part of the reason for this was rivalry and Bishops in Alexandria, Constantinople and Rome were jealous of their authority and the extent of their jurisdiction. As Constantinople became the most important Christian centre in the East, its bishop was designated 'Patriarch,' just as the bishop of Rome was being called 'Pope.'

In 1054 came what has been called the Great Schism. The Patriarch of Constantinople repudiated the claims of the Pope in Rome, and the Pope in turn, repudiated the Patriarch. While there were various theological, political and cultural differences that finally led to this rift, there were three main doctrinal reasons for the split. First, the Eastern Church totally refused the Pope's claim to have absolute authority in the whole Christian Church. Second, while



the Eastern Church confessed, 'I believe ... in the Holy Spirit ...who proceeds from the Father...' the Western Church added a phrase and confessed, 'I believe ...in the Holy Spirit ... who proceeds from the Father and the Son...' This added

phrase was the cause of fierce theological dispute. Third, while the Eastern Church allowed its clergy to marry, gradually the Western Church imposed celibacy on its priests.

Today the Orthodox Churches are found mainly in Greece, Romania, Bulgaria, Russia, Belarus, Georgia, Macedonia, Serbia, Moldova and Cyprus. The total number of Orthodox Christians in the world is about 220 million, making them the second largest part of Christendom. Orthodox Churches are strongly committed to the fundamental doctrines of classic Christianity, including the Trinity, the full deity and humanity of Christ and especially his resurrection. Orthodox worship is very liturgical and almost the entire service is chanted, part of it being a sung response between the priests and the congregation. Adults wishing to join an Orthodox Church must be baptised by being immersed three times in the name of the Holy Trinity. Baptism is considered a 'mystery' in which the old life with its sins is buried and a new life is given. The children of Orthodox families are normally baptised soon after birth. While Orthodox Churches seldom have the kind of statues that

are common in Roman Catholic churches, they have instead many icons. Icons are paintings depicting Christ or saints but Orthodox Christians protest that they don't 'worship' these icons; rather they use them as visible aids to devotion.

Incense is widely used in Orthodox worship. This practice is said to be a continuation of the kind of worship that was offered to God in the Temple in Jerusalem. The ingredients, mostly frankincense and resins, are burned in a golden censer, and usually this censer hangs at the end of three chains representing the Trinity. The incense is meant to portray the prayers and worship that are rising up to God.

The bitterness and rivalry that followed the Great Schism in 1054 lasted for 900 years. At Vatican II in 1964 there were attempts to 'mend fences' between the Roman Catholic Church and the Orthodox Churches. Currently Pope Benedict XV1 is making efforts to further fellowship between the two communions.

Our New Church Wall Pannels

On Sunday the 12th August Sarah and I set off to Much Wenlock, in Shropshire, to meet with the proprietor of Croft Designs (featured in the BBC programme 'A Vicar's Life'). It was 'Croft' who made our new altar frontals that were paid for from a bequest by the late Dorothy Skinner. As there were still funds available, from that bequest, it was decided that we would employ Croft Designs to manufacture some wall panels to be mounted behind the altar.

On Monday 13th August Sarah and I returned from Much Wenlock with said panels in our car (people carrier - each panel is eight feet long!!) and by the time you read this article they will be mounted in the church as planned.

There are three panels that individually portray The Father (Alpha & Omega symbols), The Son (The Cross) and The Holy Spirit (Dove & Fire) but as a complete set display The Trinity - God as three in one, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Helping to draw the whole thing together is a grapevine laden with fruit - Jesus said "I am the true vine" (John 15:1).

The picture accompanying this doesn't do justice as to how stunning these panels are and I would highly recommend you to visit the church and see them for yourself. I truly believe that these beautiful pieces of work give a very real sense of the glory of God at work in our church and our community.

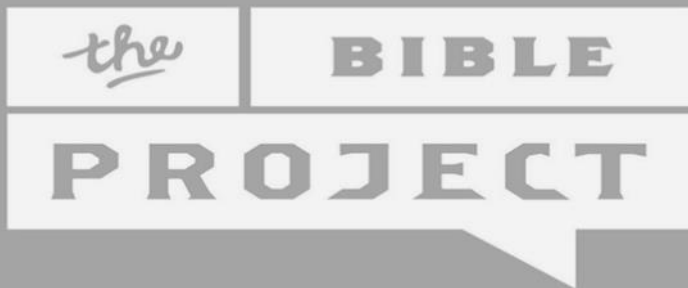
